'Idle Primary is a caring and supportive school. Pupils know that there is always someone that they can talk to if they are worried. They appreciate the chance to resolve problems together'.

'The school prioritises reading. Pupils are introduced to an array of high-quality books from the moment they start at the school. Many go on to learn to love reading. The school's phonics programme is well established, with regular checks and support for those needing extra help'.

'The school curriculum is ambitious for all pupils and reflects the school's values. From the early years onwards, it is intended to engage pupils and encourage them to be inquisitive, independent learners'.

'Pupils' behaviour is calm and positive. As soon as they start, pupils are taught to be ready, respectful and safe. A small number of pupils who need extra help in managing their behaviour are very well supported'.



In some subjects, and in the early years, the precise knowledge that pupils should learn is not identified consistently. As a result, teachers are unclear about what they should be teaching and when in these areas. The school must ensure it identifies the most important knowledge and concepts that pupils need to learn clearly and consistently, so that the implementation of the curriculum can be more effective.

Redesigned Long Term Plan, reviewed topics and when content is taught.

Created a new progression of skills and knowledge across each area of learning. Skills are built and developed throughout the year Key knowledge and skills identified at each assessment point to identify if pupils are on track/ not on track and where specific gaps are that can be addressed.

Key knowledge/ facts from each area of learning identified along side subject leaders and curriculum lead – this is inline with the rest of school.

How will my child learn?

- Children will learn through a mixture of direct teaching and engaging in continuous provision
- Continuous provision describes all of the different provision areas which are
 available for your children to use every day. Within each of these areas of
 provision there will be a core range of resources that children can use all of the
 time, throughout the whole year. In addition to core resources teachers will
 enhance each area to make it enticing and relevant to the children and their
 learning.
- Examples of continuous provision areas: Reading, Writing, Maths, Construction,
 Small World, Role Play, Sand, Playdough and Water.

Snacks, food & other experiences

- Fresh fruit is available every day
- Milk is also available every day
- Children should bring a named water bottle from home every day.
- All children are entitled to a free school meal every lunchtime until the end of Year 2.
- Menus are available online and on the school website.
- Menus follow a 3-week cycle and include popular meal choices, including vegetarian, which are freshly prepared on site. Alternatives choices include sandwiches and jacket potatoes.
- On our transition days in July there will be an opportunity to try a school dinner.
- If you so wish, your child can bring in a packed lunch from home. We ask that
 these contain no chocolate bars, sweets or fizzy drinks and food containing
 nuts.
